About Our Presenter

Stephen E. Usher, Ph. D. is an economist with expertise in money, banking and financial markets; He received his doctorate form the University of Michigan in 1978 and then served as a staff economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of NY from 1978-1980. His tenure overlapped with Paul Volcker, president of the NY Fed until President Carter appointed him Federal Chairman in August 1979. After heading the Anthroposophic Press from 1980-1988, Mr. Usher joined a premiere international firm of consulting economists (NERA) and specialized in securities and financial markets. Mr. Usher established his own economic consulting business in 1999. He has lectured hundreds of

times in business, cultural and academic settings and taught economics courses at Rockland Community College in NY and at SUNY. Mr. Usher has published numerous books. Stephen lives in Austin, Texas with his Eurythmist wife Beth.

THE THEME OF THE YEAR: THINKING OF THE HEART AS AN ORGAN OF PERCEPTION FOR DEVELOPMENTAND METAMORPHOSIS

(This was given as a talk at Michaelmas by Kathleen Wright)

This year the Eastern Regional Council made a request that each group and branch observe some aspect of the Theme of the Year at its Michaelmas celebration. As you know, the Anthroposophical Society announces its theme of the year every Easter and it is usually taken up by a community in some way the following Michaelmas. Often one of the recommended books will be taken up in branch meetings or perhaps a guest speaker will talk on the topic. For the past four years, the theme has been some aspect of "Heart Thinking". This year the specific title is "Thinking of the Heart as an Organ of Perception for Development and Metamorphosis". By "organ of perception" Steiner is of course, not referring to the physical heart, but what Eastern religions call the heart chakra or the 12-petalled lotus, a spiritual area that surrounds the heart. By "metamorphosis" he is referring to the fact that through meditative practice and character development this organ of perception evolves and develops new abilities.

This theme of "metamorphosis" whose synonym is "evolution" was chosen because this year marks the two hundredth birthday of Charles Darwin and the 150th anniversary of the publication of his book Origin of the Species. The whole scientific community is commemorating this event all over the world and it was felt that it was important to shed some anthroposophical insight into the theory. While Steiner felt that Darwin's ideas were one-sided and materialistic, and that the philosophy that arose out of it (natural selection and survival of the fittest) was very ahrimanic, he also said that there is a "deeper understanding of Christianity that lies in Darwinism". In other words, while Darwin had some misguided conclusions about evolution, the actual idea of evolution was extremely important, for all of Creation is evolving, even the Angels are evolving into Archangels, the Archangels into Archai, and so on. Mankind is destined to become the 10th Hierarchy of angels, the Spirits of Love and Freedom. While Darwin's theory holds that man is just a higher animal or "naked ape", an anthroposophist might call man instead an evolving angel or a "dressed angel" (as an anthropsophical book is entitled). The theme of evolution is in evidence in almost every topic Steiner addressed: spiritual development, the evolution of consciousness, the metamorphosis of plants and many others. Because there are so many topics involving evolution, several books and suggestions have been made for studying this year's theme.

These include: The book *Macrocosm and Microcosm*, which specifically talks about the development of the heart chakra; Chapter 4 of *Occult Science* which deals with the evolutions of the Earth; Chapter 5 of the same book which deals with spiritual development; "The Being of Man and His Future Evolution", "Three Streams in Human Evolution" and *The Inner Realities of Evolution*; all of Goethe's Scientific Works, especially his *Metamorphosis of the Plants*; Steiner's Mystery Dramas to observe how the characters evolve through their various incarnations. It is the latter example which we observed in our community this Michaelmas with Marlene Joyce's presentation of Goethe's Fairy Tale of *The Green Snake and the Beautiful Lily*, as Steiner was inspired to write his Mystery Dramas after reading Goethe's tale. So one could say that this is the beginning of the study of those characters. This past summer Margaretta and Bruce Bornhorst hosted a Study group on *The Portal of Initiation* and hopefully, the work will continue in the coming year. *(continued on next page)*

We would like to also mention one very interesting aspect of the metamorphosis of the heart chakra which was learned in the Biography Study Group of which I was a part last year. We learned that empathy is one of the abilities that the awakened heart develops. We were amazed to hear that the word "empathy" was first coined in 1912 by a German psychologist named Theodor Lipps. (I thought it was an ancient Greek word!) The word was not used in America until 1928! This is because the phenomenon was undeveloped for centuries and then probably not recognized when it first began to manifest. It is still in its early phase, even though the word is quite common and we speak of individuals being "empaths". While the word is related to sympathy and compassion, it is far more spiritual evolved. When you have sympathy for a person, you feel sorry for them. That puts you in a superior position. No normal person wants sympathy from others – but empathy is a totally different story. When a person has empathy, you are at one with them and therefore on equal levels. You feel what they are feeling. It is a more Christ-like virtue than sympathy. Eventually, Steiner tells us that empathy will lead us to an understanding of another person's destiny. We will then know not only know what another is feeling, but why they are feeling it and what its purpose is.WE will feel their very destiny. This is reminiscent of the word "entelechy" which Renate Wend so often mentions. (It is the sum total of a human being with all of their incarnations.) When we have developed our hearts to that point of empathy, Steiner says that our encounters with other human beings will be actual sacraments. There is a Christian Community minister named Baruch Urieli who has written a couple of really beautiful books about the development of Empathy. Our Biography Study Group read a couple of chapters from one of them, which I highly encourage all to read. These are entitled: Learning to Experience the Etheric World : "Empathy, the After-image and a New Social Ethic" and "Karmic Experience, Karmic Research and the Power of Empathy". He has also written: *Male and Female: Developing Empathy*. Both books are from Temple Lodge Press. MICHAELMAS and the economic tasks at hand

Everywhere today, in conversations and the media, we can hear questions concerning money, economics and the economy. In a recent associative economics workshop, Dr. Christopher Houghton Budd alluded to the fact that "Many economists acknowledge we may be at an economic sea change with no going back." The old ways of perceiving money, price, and markets no longer work or are unsustainable. The economy of the world is tottering. Everyone worldwide is being schooled by economic circumstances today. Many can cite the imperfections of our present economic systems, but it is rare to find those who can apply Rudolf Steiner's contributions to economic life to current world affairs and chart the course ahead.

As we enter the season of Michealmas, which begins on September 29th, the festival celebration day of the Archangel Michael, we can ask the questions, *What is the relationship between Michael, the human will, and money? How can we align our wills with the Archangel Michael as economic circumstances require our attention?*

The Beginnings of the Current Michael Age

According to the spiritual research of Rudolf Steiner, the event foreseen by John and described in the *Book of Revelation* depicting the great war in heaven where "Michael and His angels fought and the Dragon and his angels fought" began in the 1840's and concluded in 1879. After the dragon and his hosts are cast to the earth by Michael, from this time forward, Steiner asserts, human souls are continuously tested and tempted by these fallen spirits of darkness as they seek their influence in the subconscious depths. Steiner refers to these fallen beings as Ahriman and his hosts.

This battle in the heavenly realms occurs, Steiner observes, when the Archangel Michael assumes His rulership as Time Spirit for humanity for the next cycle of 350 years between the years of 1879 and 2229. We are now roughly one third of the way into this Michaelic Age. As the spirits of darkness are cast to the earth, Michael also releases the supersensible wisdom and intelligence of the cosmos so it can begin to enter the hearts and thoughts of human beings.

On the earth in 1879, Rudolf Steiner, in his 18th year, took up the task to redeem thinking through his seminal breakthrough experience for his book, *The Philosophy of Spiritual Activity*. In his journal, in 1879, he wrote, *Ahriman smashed*. While Michael completes his battle in the heavenly realms and Ahriman and his hosts are cast to the earth, Rudolf Steiner, as Michael's greatest pupil, begins his life work to help humanity overcome the dragon of materialism. In 1879 Steiner forged a path to the experience of spiritual realities as he witnessed his own soul-being engaged in free thought activity. In other words, he experienced the essential nature and freedom of his "I" (that which one says "I" to) in the activity of thinking. This is an experience which can be had by all human beings. The experience of the "I", and the recognition of its freedom of choice and creativity in thinking, can be the leverage point as a first step in the attainment

supersensible consciousness. Steiner inwardly broke through the barriers of materialistic thinking thereby *smashing Ahriman*, who would have us believe, the physical world is the only reality.

Countering the Spirits of Darkness

Thirty-three and a third years after 1879, in 1912/13, two great events occurred. The first event was the first printing of the *Calendar of the Soul*. The cover of this Calendar read, *1879 years after the birth of the I*. Steiner spiritually witnessed the birth of the "I" as a new possibility for human beings in earthly consciousness in 33.3 AD: the earthly experience of death by the being of Christ becomes a Spirit-birth and new experiential possibility for all of humanity. Thirty three and a third years after 1879, and 1879 years after the birth of the I in 33.3 AD, Rudolf Steiner now delivers a Calendar with the beginnings of Michaelic cosmic wisdom detailed on every page. Verses are included, which Steiner said came *through* him, from his spiritual teacher, to accompany the human soul through the cycle of the year .

Another second event occurs on Sept. 20, 1913 when Rudolf Steiner lays the Foundation Stone - the double-pentagonal dodecahedron - for the building of the first Goetheanum down thirteen steps on the Dornach Hill. For the first time he shares with us the entirety of the Macrocosmic Lord's Prayer as the first revelation of the *Fifth Gospel*:

Aum, Amen! the evils hold sway, Witness of egoity becoming free, Selfhood-guilt, through others incurred, Experienced in the daily bread Wherein the Will of the Heavens does not rule, In that man severed himself from Your kingdom and forgot your names Ye Fathers in the Heavens. - Rudolf Steiner - Sept. 1913

A month later, in his lectures now entitled *The Fifth Gospel*, Steiner reveals that the above words describe the deep soul pain that Jesus experienced as he witnessed how human beings had severed themselves from their Divine origins. After the baptism when Christ incarnates into the body of Jesus, Christ Jesus immediately goes into the wilderness for 40 days and 40 nights. Ahriman (Satan) tempts Christ with the words, Turn gold into bread if thou wouldst boast of Divine Power. Christ answers by saying, "The human being does not live by bread alone but by every Word that proceeds from the mouth of the Logos."

Steiner recounts how this temptation was not fully overcome in that encounter by Christ in the wilderness, but pointed to a future time when our economic trials through having to work for our daily bread, would lead to the possibility of a world community of individuals who make economic choices out of brotherly Love. People at the time of Christ did not know that they may have incurred karmic guilt in relation to what they did to earn their daily bread.

War and its Threefold Antidote

Three months after the laying of the Foundation Stone, a counter-event occurs in America, when on Dec. 23, 1913, Woodrow Wilson signs into law the Federal Reserve Act, granting the right for a privately owned central bank to re-establish itself on American soil. Like a conception point, nine months later, the entire world is plunged into war. For the first time a World War breaks out in Europe - a cruel and senseless war. The consciousness was darkened among all those who were in leadership positions participating in the War.

To fight the decline in the nations of the world that were involved in the war, Rudolf Steiner sent a Threefold Memorandum given to Walter Johannes Stein, to deliver to the cabinet of the emperor Franz Joseph. The memorandum was never read. Rudolf Steiner said, *if we do not threefold, we will continue to go to war.* Steiner forwarded the cry of the French Revolution - Liberty, Equality, Fraternity - so it could be seen within the context of culture, law, and economics for human beings of all cultures and races. Steiner offered a possibility to transcend the nationalism that came to the fore instead.

If we look at the work of Rudolf Steiner in retrospect, we can see that he unfolded his public teachings in three seven year cycles, offering spiritually awakened impulses out of his own new threefold soul faculties of: thinking, feeling, and willing. Outwardly he articulated a new relationship to culture, law, and economics. For years Steiner lectured on the threefold commonwealth. In 1922 he gave the epical lecture course entitled, *World Economy.*

Now for the first time in earth evolution, an initiate would speak out of initiation science on the fundamental foundations of a new economic science. Attendants of these courses said it was the most difficult of the lectures that Steiner gave. The course lay dormant, was read by few, and seldom understood by anyone.

The Refounding of the Mysteries

On New Year's Eve of 1922/23 Rudolf Steiner and his soul companion, Ita Wegman watched the burning flames consume the nearly completed Goetheanum. The building was an architectural work of art, designed by Rudolf Steiner and worked on by people from all over the world. It was to be the home of the Anthroposophical Society, which Steiner was not yet directly a part of, but was the inspirer for the Society. During the burning, Ita Wegman asked Rudolf Steiner a question, *Can the Mysteries be Refounded?* She was referring to the ancient Mystery cultures of India, Persia, Egypt, and Greece whereby the whole community was governed with insights from the wisdom of the spiritual world. This pivotal question would lead Rudolf Steiner to refound the Anthroposophical Society with the intention to lead it over to an experiential three-folding of all the new impulses arising out of his life's work. He would assume leadership and his intention was to threefold the social life emanating from the Society as an example to the world. Europe had not been able to accept the threefold impulse, but Steiner set out to three-fold the Society with the help of Ita Wegman and his closest colleagues.

One year later, between Christmas Eve and New Year's Day of 1923/24, Rudolf Steiner chose a Vorstand (we might call in the West a board of directors) and united his karma with the Society and humanity at large by becoming the President. Within the Society was the School of Spiritual Science which was intended to have three classes, relating to spiritual, rights and economics life.

Rudolf Steiner's Intentions for a Threefold Anthroposophical Movement

How did Rudolf Steiner imagine the threefold Anthroposophical Movement? How did he intend to put into practice the threefold practices of spiritual/cultural freedom, equality in the political/rights life, and a collaborative brotherly-sisterly economic life?

1. The newly refounded Anthroposophical Society with its School of Spiritual Science and its envisioned First, Second, and Third Classes operated in the cultural realm where Steiner envisioned that religion, art, and science could unfold free from state intrusion. Anyone could gain general admittance to the Society who acknowledged Anthroposophy or Spiritual Science as a contribution to culture. Steiner envisioned that millions of Michaelites would join the Society as members.

If members wished to be a representative or practitioner of Anthroposophy to the public, the possibility existed to join the First Class of the School of Spiritual Science. The First Class lessons offered spiritual training to further the soul development of supersensible faculties of thinking, feeling, and willing. These developed soul faculties were intended to be a kind of spiritual armor for those who would venture forth publicly in service of the new science of the spirit. The First Class lessons were to facilitate a strengthening of consciousness that could perceive the spirits of darkness who would strive to hinder practical spiritual work in the world.

The initiation experience that was formerly only available through the precincts of the mystery temples was now accessible to anyone who sought admittance. Ita Wegman was given verbal instruction from Rudolf Steiner and was to lead the First Class with the contents that Steiner shared directly from Michaelic inspiration. Within the School would be professional sections so colleagues could find their way to one another in a spirit of collaboration. An untold number could be found within its ranks.

2. The rights relationships would be found mediating between the cultural and economic spheres in the form of the statutes and bylaws. The rights realm would be related to the Second Class of the School. The Second Class was envisioned to help members work hygienically in a spirit of collaboration. Rudolf Steiner intended that Marie Steiner preside over this center position comprised of 36 individuals forming the Second Class of the School of Spiritual Science.

3. The Goetheanum Association would actively work in the economic realm and would administer land ownership, the book business, pharmaceuticals, and other business initiatives. This Association would be comprised of a group of 12 and were to be instructed by the contents directly delivered by Rudolf Steiner in the Third Class of the School of Spiritual Science. Rudolf Steiner himself intended to preside over the Third Class with members of the Goetheanum Association.

Unfulfilled Intentions

Steiner died in 1925 with only a fragment of the First Class lessons of the School of Spiritual Science completed. The second and third classes were not begun before Steiner's death. Karmic jealousies amongst the appointed leadership held sway. The Vorstand or board of directors broke. Many members who wanted to fulfill the threefold intentions of Rudolf Steiner, including Ita Wegman and Walter Johannes Stein were asked to leave the Society. Ita Wegman said, If the Vorstand breaks, the beast of the Apocalypse will rise out of the abyss. In 1933, Hitler rose to power and years later, the second World War ignited.

Unbeknownst to many members, then and now, the statutes of the refounded anthroposophical Society were rejected by the Swiss authorities and never ratified into law.

The Goetheanum Association, which lawfully should have operated from the economic realm, at an extraordinary general meeting in Dec.1924, changed its name to the General Anthroposophical Society and now operated confusingly from both the economic and the cultural realm. The economic and cultural impulses that were meant to be separated out were and still are co-mingled.

What are the deep karmic consequences of the un-threefolded Anthroposophical Society?

Rudolf Steiner foresaw the challenges of our current time and made a prediction: at the beginning of this century we would either see the dawn of a new age or the grave of civilization. Speaking to a group of individuals on karma and reincarnation, he stated that everyone in his company would be back at the end of the last century to battle the spirits of darkness who wish to destroy the earth prematurely.

So what can we do now to further Steiner's vision and work?

If we look at the progression of the intended First, Second, and Third Classes, we can intuit that the economic aspects of social life could be the most challenging from a Michaelic perspective. Now as we enter the second third of this Michael Age, the socio-economic realm is now demanding our attention from all directions.

New Corporate Economic Forms

Prior to the lectures on *World Economy*, Steiner was directly involved with *The Coming Day Stock Company*. It is obvious that he was on to something. If we look at the world today we see franchises and multi-national corporations everywhere. It seems quite plausible, if Steiner would have lived longer, he would have made the Goetheanum Association into a Corporation in which members could have paticipated with stock ownership.

What would a Michaelic-inspired corporate vehicle look like in contrast to a traditional corporate model? Could we imagine a corporate vehicle where the bylaws reflect a harmonious three-fold interaction between the spiritually-inspired mission of the company, the rights-working relationships of the managers and employees, and the economic participation of the share-holders?

In Steiner's imagination of the 12 individuals in the Third Class we are reminded of the 12 apostles surrounding the Christ, the twelve seats around King Arthur's roundtable and the spiritual influences which stream toward us from the 12 constellations of the zodiac.

Could it be that these 12 would hold the mission and moral conscience of businesses that would be birthed out of every practical endeavor arising out of Anthroposophy? Perhaps these twelve could provide beneficial spiritual support and guidance without hampering the rights of the entrepreneurs and workers? Could checks and balances be put in place to insure that the mission could never be bought out with money in a stock take-over?

In contrast to traditional corporate models, could the bylaws be fashioned in such a way that shareholder profit is not the guiding principle for decision making? Can we create such a model?

New Community Dynamics

As an example, a 501C3 nonprofit called Wellspring Living Arts has begun a new educational program in the Spring Valley, NY area. Its focus is to provide practical training of the will in the arts arising out of Anthroposophy. The possibility exists for businesses to be incubated out of this endeavor. Practical hands on training and real life education will be provided with a focus on youth, but with a long-term vision for people of all ages. The vision and mission of Wellspring Living Arts has all the elements necessary to build a healthy relationship between cultural training and sustainable for-profit business. The possibility exists to carry out the intentions for a threefold business entity or entities with new Michaelic forms as envisioned by Rudolf Steiner.

Can you imagine young people building houses as apprentices to master builders, growing food for the onsite cafe, creating menus that nourish the threefold human being? Can we find our way to support young people so they can find how to best use their talents and to support them with an opportunity to fulfill their dreams? . . . to wed vision with timelines and budget disciplines? ... to work associatively with skills and talents for mutual growth and learning? ... to learn good business communication skills? ... to participate in annual general meetings of share-holders, board members, and workers?

Air Beneath Your Wings

The threefold village community idea may sound good, but how do we begin with practical steps? Education is key. On October 30th and 31st, 2009, *Wellspring Living Arts* will sponsor Arthur Edwards of the *Centre for Associative Economics*, for an evening and full day at *Threefold Educational Center*. His keynote address is entitled, *Air Beneath Your Wings*. In the workshop, he will address *Financial Literacy for Free Initiative*. It is intended to be a practical response to the global financial crises. The workshop is inspired in part from the book, *Freeing the Circling Stars* by Christopher Houghton Budd. Financial literacy, community dynamics, pre-funded education, legal forms and cash flow is the focus of the book.



This double event focuses on how Rudolf Steiner's economic thinking can be given practical effect today. A special emphasis is on whether and how economics, as financial literacy, is taught in schools. Educational initiatives arising today will have profound consequences for tomorrow's thinking if, in both the form and content of their economics, they can embody an approach that is coherent from idea to practice. In the cultural life of one generation the economic life of the next is born.

Nothing less than a new economic paradigm is now needed.

The Global Financial Crisis – Humanity at a Threshold

The global financial crisis will be resolved by the simple expedient of governments printing money, the long-term cost of which will be the burden onto general future productivity. Business will return to normal and people will wonder what all the fuss was about. But credit for initiative will be harder to come by – and the importance of it less understood. Unless, that is, ethical individualism – the foundation of free initiative – can realise itself in the *field of finance*, in the *structure of education* and in *the curriculum*.

Financial Literacy and The Waldorf Challenge

The Waldorf Movement was founded out of the ideal of a 'free spiritual life'. One of the greatest challenges today is to keep the door to free initiative open. Is it enough to be taught *personal* finance or should this be extended to *societal* finance, which deals with matters of trading and capitalization? Do the times require that Waldorf Schools become examples of financial literacy both in terms of the way they conduct their own economies and in the way they are financed? Such examples would not go unnoticed in the wider world of finance, nor in the souls of the students.

How young people can find and develop the skills they need to pursue their vocations is a crucial matter. Moreover the capital that corresponds to their initiatives must be made available to them, that is if they are not to be swallowed by the 'jobs market'. The goal of independence, which informs the 'free spiritual life', is realised in the vocational path one treads. But what kind of curricula and what kind of schools can enable this?

These questions are not only of individual or local significance: they concern the future unfolding of economic life. For the present crisis marks a boundary where the conventional approach to economic questions has reached a threshold. This is linked to the 'problem' of surplus capital. Financial markets rely on the idea that in a global economy one can hold onto capital 'in the abstract'. But such an approach, which necessarily engenders fictional values, has been found wanting; it is built on an old 'monolithic' conception of money. Only a massive global infusion of government spending and guarantees has forestalled the day of reckoning: but for how long and at what cost?

Rudolf Steiner's monetary analysis belongs not in a parallel universe but in the very real issues with which humanity is confronted today. It offers the sophisticated tool needed for balance to be restored to the world economy. It could also be embedded as accounting in curricula which connect to the true aspirations of the young: to follow their own stars as they build their own paths. This would mean managing the economy on a new citizenized basis wherein individuals act in voluntary and conscious association rather than, as now, out of the pressure of ever-more centralization.

Based in part on ideas set out in the accompanying literature*, the aim of the workshop is to present various propositions as a basis for rigorous debate and discussion among the participants. It is open to everyone with an interest in such topics, whether young people themselves, those concerned with education (teachers, parents, administrators or bursars) or those working to further Rudolf Steiner's economic impulse.



MICHAELIC INSPIRED COINAGE

From the Mystery Language of Ancient Greece to the Fall of the Spirits of Darkness in 1879 Helios Silver Drachm from 4th Century BC

The Obverse: Portrays the Sun-face of Radiant Helios The Reverse: An enlarged rose (signifying deep transformation) with a stylized figure of Aphrodite

holding a bouquet on left.



Pupils undergoing initiation in the rites of the sun Mysteries were able to gather soul knowledge of the living life-sustaining Being that streamed to them from the sun. They glimpsed the Macrocosmic Logos (Word) who had not yet come to live amongst human beings in the flesh. European tradition held for

centuries that this token was actually one of the thirty pieces of silver used to betray the Christ by Judas after the Last Supper. The silvery

reflective qualities of the moon came between Judas and the Christ. It is ironic to think that this token bearing reverence to the sun god may have been used in the betrayal of Christ, often called Christos Sun in esoteric Christianity. Judas typified the loss of reverence of the coins and what was impressed upon them. The Sun Being of Christ Jesus was



also not comprehended. During the Middle ages, these coins were brought back from pilgrimages to the Holy Land and considered sacred, possessing supernatural powers. These pagan coins bearing the sun god Helios came to be objects of Christian veneration and piety.

Extremely Fine Syle and Wonderful Execution

Ephesian Bee Silver Tetradrachm from 390-330 BC



The Obverse is hand-struck with the image of a Bee The Reverse: a Palm Tree and the Forepart of a Stag At the dawn of the last Michael Age beginning in 550 BC, some of the earliest coinage was struck in the Mystery Temple of Diana in Ephesus where the mysteries of the Word were taught and held sacred. It is the last Mystery Temple where men and women were admitted and instructed equally. Individuals came to the temple to reckon with their gender and valued the intimate conversations between men and women as essential to understanding their own being. Priestesses of the temple were called *Bees*. Rudolf Steiner gave a beautiful lecture

series about the bee as a sun being and how intimately connected the bee is to our higher ego or "I". This coin is one of the earliest from Ephesus with a bee on the front and the letter E signifying being issued by the Temple of Diana in Ephesus, in the country of Ionia. The reverse portrays the forepart of a stag next to a palm tree. The planetary signature of the palm tree is the sun. The antlers of the stag ray out into its environment a sun-like nature.

Teacher and pupil walked the gardens of Ephesus and dialogued about the nature of the plant and animal kingdoms



as an expression of the Word or Logos. In the inner sanctum of the temple was a statute of the many-breasted goddess Artemis. Questions were posed to Artemis, who would offer answers to both pupil and teacher from the realm of dream and sleep. A rare and difficult coin to locate:



What is Anthroposophy?



Anthroposophy, which means "the wisdom of man", is a spiritual philosophy and path to selfknowledge, which "leads the spiritual in the human being to the spiritual in the universe", according to its teacher, Rudolf Steiner (1861-1925). Rudolf Steiner was a brilliant "Renaissance man" from Austria who was a philosopher, scientist, artist, playwright, architect, social activist, teacher and meditant, who had a direct perception of the spiritual worlds. Anthroposophy, which is also known as Spiritual Science, teaches, among other things, the laws of reincarnation and Karma. It has a Christ-centered view of world evolution. Steiner founded the School of Spiritual Science, as well as the General Anthroposophical Society, which he described as "a union of people who desire to further the life of the soul – both in the individual and in human society – on the basis of true knowledge of the spiritual world". In addition to giving over 6,000 lectures, most of which have been made into books, he helped to found many initiatives that are

still thriving today including: the Waldorf School movement, anthroposophical medicine, biodynamic farming, and Eurythmy. Based on his indications, hundreds of initiatives have developed such as: the Curative education movement, the Camp Hill Villages for the handicapped, Weleda remedies, Dr. Hauschka cosmetics, WALA, True

Botanica, Astrosophy, Rhythmical Massage, the Alliance for Childhood, The Christian Community, Anthroposophic Prison Outreach, Lazure painting, Demeter, advancements in architecture, science, social and economic reform (The Threefold Social Order, community banks), mathematics and painting. In addition, there are many publishing houses and libraries dedicated to his works throughout the world.
