## **ABOUT THE HOLY NIGHTS**

For those who have never been to a Holy Night or hosted one, here are some general remarks: Our community has been celebrating them as a community since the mid-1990's when Natalie Slapo first introduced the tradition here. The custom has been observed in Anthroposophical communities since the time of Rudolf Steiner. In the early days here, each host family did their own thing – each selected a theme and an artistic activity. Then five years ago, we began the custom which most anthroposophic communities practice – taking up one of the Gospel works of Rudolf Steiner, reading a lecture each evening. This enables folks who are unable to attend to continue the Study on their own. We have completed the four Gospel cycles, so this year we will be reading *The Fifth Gospel*.

Most evenings follow a simple format: lighting of a candle, Verse, reading the lecture, discussion, Verse, snuffing the candle and then refreshments and socializing. One is, of course, always free to alter the format, perhaps adding some music and singing or an artistic activity. Special programs occur on Christmas Eve, New Year's Eve and often on January 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> *The Three Kings Play* is read with members taking parts. (See below for more details)

**IMPORTANT NOTE:** While most Holy Nights are from 7-9 pm, some are at different times, even during the day. Please post the Holy Nights Schedule and check out the time to make sure you are attending at the correct time. It is also a good idea to let the host know you will be coming, although it is not necessary.

If this is your first time hosting, please do not take it personally if only a couple of people show up. There is a high variation in the number of attendees. Last year, the range was from 3 to 24. It is the particular night that is popular, not the host. During the first week of December, many go away to visit family, so attendance may be low. This is not to be regarded in a disappointing way. Often the most profound insights occur in small, intimate groups.

If you have never been to a Holy Night, do try to attend at least a few, especially try to make it to the homes of those you perhaps do not know so well. And if you cannot attend on a particular night, do keep up with the readings so that you can be with us in spirit!

## **Infinity Farm Continues Its Holy Nights Traditions**

In keeping with the famous legend that on **Christmas Eve**, the animals can speak, we thank them by singing Christmas carols to them in the barn at Infinity Farm. Infinity Farm has cows, goats, chickens, dogs, cats and pigs. Joy Kwapien provides a delicious biodynamic soup, bread and hot mulled cider for supper. Do bring along some of your favorite Christmas music and please make at least 7 copies to share with others.

There are some new folks at the Farm who are staying in the main house, whom you should welcome to our community – Dave and Michelina Roth and their sons Gabe age 9, Nate age 7 and Joel age 5.

On **New Year's Eve** it is customary to mix the Three King's Prep, which consists of gold, frankincense and myrrh around midnight. We will gather around 9 for food and fellowship and start the mixing around 11:30. It should be done by 12:30.

Then on **Epiphany (January 6)** the Three King's Prep is sprayed on the farm around 2 pm.

All of these are great fun, so try to participate in as many as you can!

## ADVENT SUNDAYS AT ROGER SCHULTZ'S



The Advent study will be at the home of Roger Schultz on four Sundays (November 28, December 5, 12 and 19). We will start promptly at 5 pm - participants are encouraged to arrive at least 15 minutes before we begin - and end promptly at 6:30. We will then have dinner together – dinner is provided; it is not a potluck. If possible, please let Roger know a day in advance if you intend to come, so he can prepare the right amount of food.

Advent is a time of inner preparation for Christ's coming. Our Rudolf Steiner Branch would like to invite you to join us in this preparation. Working with indications provided by Sergei Prokofieff in his *Cycle of* 

the Year, we will use the four Sundays of Advent to try to understand how opposing forces work in our soul to hinder our experiencing this most wonderful and spiritual season. We will also explore those qualities or virtues that enable us to resist such attacks.

Each week, however, the study will depend on those who come, and what they bring with them to share or discuss. By sharing personal experiences or bringing in art or literature that illustrate what we will be considering, our study will be able to delve more broadly and deeply into the issues we are considering. Through our study, we hope to bring to consciousness to what is working subconsciously within us; we hope to develop the understanding and strength to hold firm against the opposing forces, and increasingly to be able to unite ourselves with Christ as we approach His coming.

Twelve of us gathered at the home of Roger Schultz for the first Sunday of Advent. For several years now, this has been a tradition in our community and it has been evolving into an ever more heartfelt and meaningful experience for its participants. When it first began about five years ago, we read lectures by Prokofieff and Steiner about Advent and the Three Sacrifices of Christ and had discussions about them .

In the past two years, however, instead of the readings, we have simply applied the themes from Prokofieff's works and had conversations about how these themes are working in our lives at present.

This past Sunday, we spoke about how events in our own lives since Michaelmas have been manifestations of our Karma. It was enlightening to hear stories of both joy and suffering, as well as resolutions and balancing of old Karma. Many expressed their gratefulness to Anthroposophy for lighting the way to an understanding of their Karma. For some this season has been a time for joy about a new incarnation and for another, sorrow about an excarnation, although that sorrow has already been transformed into a higher joy because of the wisdom Anthroposophy.

More specifically, dear Roger revealed to us that he has been holding a secret for these past two months that he now felt ready to share. His beautiful 22-year-old daughter Maryshka crossed the Threshold on September 23, leaving behind her infant son. Instead of wallowing in grief, Roger has come to a profound understanding of the Karma of the situation and now feels closer to his daughter than ever. It has been inspiring to witness how Roger has been able to transcend what most would consider a terrible tragedy and create a new relationship with his daughter. By strange coincidence, Roger had read some of Steiner's writings about life after death shortly before his daughter's passing, and so felt prepared to deal with the situation. As he spoke, we realized that there were not 12 of us in the room but 13, and we welcomed Maryshka into our circle. – Kathleen Wright

## News from Tammy in China

Dear Friends,

As you begin to celebrate Advent and prepare for Christmas, my life in China is quite different. Oh yes, we have all the outward trappings of Christmas, such as Christmas trees, reindeer and Santa displays in the mall, fake snow on the windows, etc. The five star hotels outdo themselves with beautiful decorations and Starbucks aims to make you homesick with the whipped cream-topped coffee and a smell of Christmas, along with the tasteful Christmas music.

In my kindergarten work, I have chosen to not bring Christmas as an outward mood. I feel for myself this has been a good choice, as I feel that I, along with the Chinese people, am exploring and reviving their culture. As I do this exploration of the culture with the teachers, and hold on to a thread of the anthroposophical study of Christmas, I hope that I can come to a more universal experience of what is this time of year.

An added challenge, or another broadening factor in my work, is that I work in two vastly different areas of China. In Beijing, it is already very cold, and windy with trees which look like skeletons against the grey skies with a feeling of a much earlier time in China. By contrast, in Shenzhen where I work in one quite well-off kindergarten, it is warm; all is green, and flowers are blooming in a sunny, and modern atmosphere. The teachers naturally draw on their environment as they create their festival.

The kindergartens are choosing to celebrate Dong Zhi, which is a mid-winter festival. I held two meetings, the first in my kindergarten in the South. In this meeting, the teachers revived their memories of Dong Zhi as children. Most of the teachers are from the South. It so happens to be Dong Zhi was a very important festival in the South, much more than in the North. The teachers talked endlessly of the food, and coming together of families for the making of the food. In Beijing interestingly, the meeting took a different form, teachers from the older kindergartens shared about their festivals. The numerous not yet-one-year-old kindergartens eagerly listened and took notes. The Chinese festivals often have a kind of food, which is formed with the hands, such as tang yuan, a round ball with a filling such as sesame, or dumplings with different vegetable or meat fillings. The making of these always brings the family together in a very nice way.

The teachers were very interested to know about the Advent spiral. The Chengdu School, as well as some other schools, have the spiral as a mid-winter event. We contemplated ways of including the spiral as part of a new festival form.

The number of schools keeps expanding. The deepening of the work continues as well. Recently I had the good fortune to attend The Nan Shan Waldorf School in Beijing, (Kindergarten, first, second and seventh grades). I was truly moved by the warmth, and sincere mood of the teachers and staff. The group was clearly striving on many levels. The seventh grade teacher led a dance. The teachers looked at how to form the agenda better. They asked me to talked about teasing and bullying, which I talked about in relation to forming class community. I was present for their Child Study, which happened to be a former kindergarten child of my previous school. The whole experience was very heart warming.

Dear Friends.

As the new Heart Initiation course beginning In February approaches, we will send short reflections that may help you in your decision to join the course.

Our way through the fears that seem to be approaching with greater and greater frequency and intensity, can be found in developing the capacities of heart-consciousness and presence. It is as if the world is going through an initiation event, taking us all into the experience of the unknown future. From now on, navigating the unknown will be the human task.



The physical heart, which is simultaneously physical, soul, and spiritual presence is comfortable living in 'not-knowing'. Each heartbeat takes us into the central depth of our being and, at the same time, out to the furthest reaches of the cosmos. That is why we are 'earthly spiritual beings.' Now, however, we are being asked to become conscious of what it is to unfold bodily, in the world, as creatures in resonance with the unknown but palpable patterning of the Whole.

If we are not able to come into alignment with what spiritual evolution is now asking, we risk either being torn apart by emotional tensions, overwhelming feelings of sorrow and longing, and irresolvable depressions, or worse, falling into a kind of simulated existence. Our first work in the course develops practices of aligning body, soul, and spirit with the prefect wholeness of the interior of the heart.

Here, within the heart that is also the soul of the world, we come to the presence of truth. While our mind can easily fool us concerning truth, the heart lives only in this dimension. It is not some outer version of truth, not some declarative absolute, but the rhythmic, resonant presence of coherence and music-like harmony, within us and in relation with others. We cannot develop such a harmonic sense of living true to being by our mind and our thinking. We can find what that is like by learning to enter the Silence of the heart. Then, such momentary 'visits' can develop into entirely new forms of conscious practical ways of being and acting.





**Anthroposophy**, which means "the wisdom of man", is a spiritual philosophy and path to self-knowledge, which "leads the spiritual in the human being to the spiritual in the universe", according to its teacher, Rudolf Steiner (1861-1925). **Rudolf Steiner** was a brilliant "Renaissance man" from Austria who was a philosopher, scientist, artist, playwright, architect, social activist, teacher and meditant, who had a direct perception of the spiritual worlds. Based on his indications, hundreds of initiatives have developed such as: the Curative education movement, the Camp Hill Villages for the handicapped, Weleda remedies, Dr. Hauschka cosmetics, WALA, True Botanica, Astrosophy, Rhythmical Massage, the Alliance for Childhood, The Christian Community, Anthroposophic Prison Outreach, Lazure painting, Demeter, advancements in architecture, science, social and economic reform (The Threefold Social Order, community banks), mathematics and painting.
