PROGRESS MADE TOWARD AN ANTHROPOSOPHICAL COMMUNITY FOR HANDICAPPED AND ELDERLY IN NORTH CAROLINA!

Kerry Kafafian, whom we wrote about two years ago when she first came to Chapel Hill with her dream of starting a Camphill-like community here, returned the last week of February to continue her networking and searching in order to put all the pieces together. Kerry is a powerhouse of will and determination. She has already incorporated her initiative as a non-profit in North Carolina, written By-laws and Articles. She is calling her community "Bunny Hill". When asked why she chose this name, Kerry explained that her nickname for her 14-year old son Kevin, who has autism, is "Bunny". She also said that the image of bunnies makes one feel protective. Bunnies are gentle like handicapped persons. She also said that the name is "easy to remember" and that this is good for marketing purposes.

Kerry has already drawn up the architectural plans for the first building – a 4,000 square foot building that will house 12 people. Kerry envisions a community that will have all the best aspects of a Camphill Village, but also abide by the licensing requirements of the state and federal government, so that the community can receive as much aid as possible. This community should not be just for the rich, but for anyone who wants to share in its ideals. There will be almost a 1:1 ratio between coworkers and residents so that there will be more than adequate care for all. The community will be anthroposophical – with the Festivals, biodynamic farming, Waldorf and curative education; there will be Foundation Studies for the coworkers; both elderly and handicapped people will be served. The community will have cottage industries (such as baking and toymaking) and a medical practice. Kerry has visited a number of Camphill Villages and has also been networking with non-anthroposophical farm communities such as Innisfree in Virginia and with the Autism Housing Initiative in Durham, NC.

The only piece missing in the puzzle is the land itself. Kerry's dream property is the 26-acre tract next to Infinity Farm. Unfortunately, the people living there changed their minds about selling, but Kerry has been persistently asking them if they have changed their minds yet. If Kerry cannot be close to a biodynamic farm, she may have to locate near an organic farm instead, but she is not ready to give up yet. Kerry hope to begin construction next year right after her eldest son Patrick graduates form High School.

Kerry plans another visit here the first week of April. She is interviewing all sorts of people in hopes that qualified and interested persons will join her Board of Directors.

Home Funeral Workshop held on February 19th

It was encouraging to experience the definite level of interest that was expressed in learning how to care for loved ones at death. People came for many reasons: because they wished to take part in this service in their communities, or wanted their children to know the details of how they wanted to be cared for when they died, or for some, there had been the shock of a hospitalization that brought up the fragility of life and the need to make plans for dying whenever that should happen.

The workshop addressed the two aspects of what comes so strongly to the fore when someone dies: the closeness of the spirit and at the same time the need for taking care of the physical; or, in other words, the deep soul-spiritual experience and with it, the opportunity for community building and the pressing practical details in caring for a dead body, arranging a vigil and funeral, and fulfilling the legal requirements of the laws pertaining to death in each state.

We addressed the historical development of embalming and the usurping of death care by the modern funeral movement that has become a powerful billion dollar business. How the home funeral movement is a return to the age-old tradition of caring for the dead at home with the involvement of the whole community.

Together as a group, we set up for a vigil, and with a volunteer as a body, we enacted the washing and caring for the body, remembering the importance of creating mood and sacred space...lifting up what was for the one who has past that which was meaningful in their life.


It was necessary to speak about the laws. To be reminded that it is legal for family to care for their own at death and even to bury someone on your own land if you do not live in a city. However, there are many assumptions that you can't do this, so preparation and the support of others who have done this are crucial.

We ended by speaking about Green Burial cemeteries where bodies are buried in biodegradable caskets or shrouds without embalming and without tombstones...only a rock marker from the land. This is an answer to the tragic polluting of our earth by toxic embalming fluids, concrete of the required vaults in conventional cemeteries, and the steel and precious woods in which bodies are encased. News From Whitted-Bowers Biodynamic Farm



It appears the red maple buds are about to burst making for a lot of happy bees. This time of year is always difficult for our local invertebrates as the food stores of honey in the hives is usually all gone by now, especially after such a cold December and January. One can witness life seeping back into the hives as they take to flight on these days with temperatures in the 60's. News of the red maple blossoms will make way through the colonies as only bees can do, bringing with it the promise of renewal. After our winter of turning in, we also feel a sense of renewal albeit not stemming from rest and relaxation. Lots has been happening and we are physically tired but full of enthusiasm and excitement about the season and the things that lie ahead.

This past November, we built our first hoop house (an unheated greenhouse in which we plant directly into the ground) courtesy of a grant from the Natural Resource Conservation Service. The hoop house will bring us to the markets sooner and allow us to grow later in the season as well. We will be back at the Carrboro and Eno River Farmers' Markets in a week or two with loads of asian greens and heirloom lettuces as we await the arrival of asparagus sometime around the beginning of April. Shortly after the asparagus, with any good fortune the strawberries will arrive. While there are still some hurdles to overcome, it looks to be a strong crop. Strawberry season can be an extraordinarily beautiful and intensely emotional as the nature spirits are on overdrive and we are filled with gratitude and awe.

Lastly, we are very excited to share the news that we recently were awarded a grant from RAFI (Rural

Advancement Foundation International) to expand our pick your own and market presence with certified biodynamic and certified organic fruit. We have a brand new plum, pear, cherry, Asian persimmon and pomegranate orchard to add to our apples, figs, blueberries and grapes. By the end of the year, we will also be putting in peaches, nectarines, apricots, hardy kiwis and more apples, blackberries and raspberries to round out our season. All this has kept us very busy, but our spirits couldn't be higher as the farm moves us closer to a dream. As always, everyone is welcome to come by and visit. It seems we are always here!

New Zealand Earthquake Affects Waldorf school in christchurch

Letter received from Thomas Proctor, Principal of the Christchurch Rudolf Steiner School:

Hello everyone in our Federation and Steiner network of schools and friends,

Thank you everyone who has contacted me over the last days. Our little city is in ruins. There is tragedy everywhere that you see both in the news and things that you may never hear. It is so so awful and fills me with tears that so many people have died, so many have torn amputations, spinal injuries, crushed bodies, weeping spirits and that the whole city is ruined - from every historic building to the most modern. The effects will be decades in rebuilding.

We personally are ok. My family is ok and we have had damage but minor compared to most.

School was evacuated at 12.51 on Tuesday. Getting out of my office was like trying to walk on a rocking ship's deck - grasping for handrails before being tossed in the other direction. Files were falling, draws flying open. The kids ran to their designated areas. everyone was accounted for. Children were weeping and hugging. Many of the teachers who were terrified after the last quake were pale and shaking, but overcame this to bring calmness to their classes. I am so proud of them all. Most kids' jackets were inside. It got colder and, with big quakes every few minutes, their anxiety rose - especially as they saw houses on the hills behind us collapsing.

Our flash text communication system with every parent was useless as power was gone. We waited and parents slowly and frantically arrived. Some had run from the city centre and brought stories of modern buildings collapsing. Others told of roads broken and water gushing onto the streets, liquifaction creating gaping holes in roads. St Martins supermarket - just over the river - was impossible to get to. The kindergarten children sat with Robyn and Frances and Annalie and Ellen and their helpers. They kept assuring the little tamariki. In the lower school, children sat in their class groups. All our practises for fire drills were SO helpful - we had class lists ticked off, barley sugars, blankets and stories. The Upper school, who are usually a little frisky about fire drills were superb, contained and supportive of each other.

We watched quake after quake ripple across the school land, saw cracks like lightening bolts appear in the concrete slabs. We could hear the deep rumble of the next quake seconds before it struck.

As I walked around to each class I was so proud of our community of teachers and the increasing number of parents who brought in food, chocolate, bananas, pears, hugs, comfort and assurance.

Lyttelton was cut off, Sumner and Redcliffs too and there were reports that Diamond Harbour was isolated. Text messages were intimitant. We were looking at evacuating to a welfare centre. But by 5pm, most children were gone with someone who was either family or classmate. Parents who had lost their homes setup tents in the field.

School is now closed - no water, no electricity. We have to wait for a building inspection before we can return. Ironically, there was an insurance assessor inspecting damage from the last quake at school as it struck. He was upstairs in the staff workroom and saw all the computers fall to the ground.

We don't know when we will have water without sewerage as the entire infrastructure of the town is cracked. School could be a long time beginning.

A few Steiner schools have offered to have children and families who want to get out of town. Thank you very very much for the offers. I am trying to coordinate lists of frightened familes (most have no power or water or cell phones or petrol) and places in schools that are available. We are looking at Federation funds assisting this. If your school wants to do something for the earthquake you could raise money for these families or just raise money for Christ Church. The cities needs will be ongoing for a long, long time. We wonder whether the central city will survive.

Can you email back to Mark and he could set up an account for this perhaps. Please email me at Thomasp@ihug.co.nz (as school is not working) regarding places in your school and families that can take in our parents.

If you aren't in a position to do this, then pray for Christchurch and its suffering families - thank you very much. Another shock has just passed through - its a weird mixture of inner high alert and helplessness. The sense I get is that this is very different from the last quake. Apart from more deaths and more carnage, there is a weariness and exhaustion from months of vigilance and work that is now useless. That resilience to get up and get at it (like digging out the heavy clay liquifaction) is not as strong and is counter to the much talked about indominatable Canterbury spirit. I think we will need long term continual support on many levels to get over this one. Lots of love to you all, and thanks for what you can do.

In late April and early May of this year, many teachers and Anthroposophists from the Asia-Pacific region will meet in Hyderabad, India for The Asia-Pacific Anthroposophical Conference and Waldorf teachers' meeting. These events are a wonderful opportunity to meet other like-minded individuals and colleagues. The events are held every two years in different countries in the region. The last two, which were held in The Philippines and Thailand were very well attended by mainland Chinese teachers and individuals working to support the development of Waldorf education. As the next meeting approaches, the Chinese attendance will be much lower due to the growing financial needs of the kindergartens and schools.

as well as the higher costs of the actual conference. In addition, the travel funds from international organizations are much lower than in previous years.

The importance of this kind of conference for individuals from Mainland China cannot be underestimated, especially in times when the teachers are working very hard to develop a new education in a country which is undergoing great change. The conference gives the teachers a great opportunity to study, exchange ideas with others who are working with similar issues and experience many other cultures.

I am working to raise money for The Nan Shan Waldorf School, which is a developing Waldorf School in Beijing. The school began in the Fall of 2009 with a small first grade, which included a very special project of supporting three students from Guizhou, a poor southern province. The school then combined with another initiative, The Rainbow Group, which included a home kindergarten, and a very



active teacher and adult education program, which included week-long courses, weekend courses, study groups, craft groups and a library including books on Waldorf education and anthroposophy. Currently, Nan Shan Waldorf School has a home kindergarten, an on-site kindergarten, first grade, second grade, and seventh grade.

The adult and teacher training is a separate organization, which works closely with the school. The development of the school is going well, but faces many challenges as the teachers and parents work hard to build the school community while learning about Waldorf Education. In addition, the school is looking for a permanent home in the Beijing area. The school has many individuals who

have given tirelessly for the well being of the school. One very special individual is Huang Ming Yu, a

publisher, who is currently balancing teaching second grade and running a publishing company, which actively supports the education through publishing books on anthroposophy and Waldorf Education. The other individual is Kathy Hu, who is actively involved with hosting teachers, arranging teacher trainings and administrative tasks in the Nan Shan office as well as anything else needing to be handled. I encouraged Kathy and Ming Hu to attend the conference in India, but given their modesty and their commitment to the work at the school, they thought they weren't worthy and didn't have time. After talking with them about the importance of representing their school, they are willing to go. I have managed to raise a large portion of the money they need; however, I need to find raise \$900. Contributions in any amount would be greatly appreciated.

Book Review:

Praise for Gary Lamb's Latest Book: Associative Economics: Spiritual Activity for the Common Good

Thanks to Gary Lamb's new book, I can sleep a little better at night. With the publication of Associative Economics: Spiritual Activity for the Common Good, I finally have a comprehensive rendition of Rudolf Steiner's social thinking that I can give to friends and workers in the social sphere that is not only a clear and accessible introduction to Steiner's works, but which also links these ideas to current issues and social struggles. Steiner exhorted his students to never despair over indifference to or rejection of what he called the primal social thoughts. Rather, he encouraged them to think again how these ideas might be better expressed so as to inspire confidence. In this regard, Lamb has made significant progress. In the mere space of 136 pages, he not only gives a clear picture of what threefolding is all about, but he also points to its esoteric foundation, which includes the fundamental social law. Those unwilling to accept such foundations or who are skeptical of them need not turn away — they can still work with the purely cognitive principles which Steiner published in his non-esoteric 1919 book, Towards Social Renewal.

On the other hand, economists who have come to recognize the importance of a spiritual foundation such as David Korten and John Perkins, will find such a basis in Steiner's Spiritual Science, which underlies the fundamental social law. The heart of this law — cooperation, mutual aid, and concern for others — counters the present-day mantras of self-interest and economic competition, which have a widespread stranglehold on economic and political thought today. With the same ironclad necessity as a law of physics, self-interest must inevitably wreak poverty, misery, and suffering somewhere in the world. In contrast, working for one's fellows must inevitably raise the well-being of all — the real way to get all boats to rise. Those who value Christianity must surely see that the answer to the question, "Am I my brother's keeper?" is given by the parable of the Good Samaritan, not by "enlightened" self-interest and "trickle-down."

How a Christian-based western society drifted so far from the obvious answer is a question for serious contemplation, but *Associative Economics* points out a clear and practical path for the realization of the goal so many long for. However, one need not profess Christianity or any religion for that matter to take up this path to social healing and justice. Regardless of one's level of sophistication, it is possible to find something of value to assist his or her endeavors be it in health care, housing, education, labor, job creation, racial equity, human rights, environment, money and finance, economics, or government. Some progressives have called for building a consensus platform or narrative that can counter the monolithic force working against the common good. I think Lamb may have just provided them with what they are looking for

It should also be noted that Lamb is not writing from some utopian ivory tower, but has tested these ideas over many years of practical experience in manufacturing and retail management, fundraising for education, establishing and running a privately funded school voucher program; co-founding, editing, and writing for *The Threefold Review* magazine; writing two earlier books (*The Social Mission of Waldorf Education* and *Wellsprings of the Spirit*); developing and teaching an economics course for Waldorf Schools, co-founding the Social Renewal Foundation as well as the Institute for Social Renewal, and is currently a researcher at the Hawthorne Valley Center for Social Research. His selfless work for others rather than monetarily enriching himself through his efforts serves as a living example of the fundamental social law and should inspire all good-willed persons seeking fresh ideas to further their social efforts. Here they will find ideas with the strength to break through the social equivalent of concrete.

steiner's indications about earthquakes

(excerpted from the lecture "Mephistopheles and Earthquakes" given January 1, 1909 in Berlin, GA 0107 from the book *The Deed of Christ and the Opposing Spiritual Powers*

"Then we come to the sixth stratum, the "Fire Earth", containing as "substances" within it, forces that can bring about terrible havoc and destruction. It is actually into these forces that the primordial Fire has been banished. In and from this stratum the realm of Ahriman operates — in a material sense.

What manifests in the phenomena of outer nature, in air and water, in cloud formations, in lightning and thunder — all this is, so to speak, a last vestige on the earth's surface, of forces that were already connected with ancient Saturn and separated from the earth together with the sun. By what is working in these forces, the inner fire-forces of the earth are placed in the service of Ahriman. There he has the center of his activity; and whereas his spiritual influences make their way to the souls of men and lead them to error, we see how Ahriman — in a certain respect shackled — has certain foci for his activity in the interior of the earth.

Were we to understand the mysterious connections of what has come to pass on the earth under Ahriman's influence and what Ahriman's own karma has become in consequence of this, we should recognize in the quakes and tremors of the earth the connection between such grievous, tragic happenings in nature and the power that holds sway on the earth. These manifestations are something that has remained since ancient times as a reaction on the earth against the good Beings of Light.

Thus forces allied with the Beings who were thrust away from their connection with the earth at the time when the good Beings of light established the beneficent phenomena around the earth-globe, are active, and in a certain sense we can recognize the echoings of these fire-forces which in earlier times were withdrawn from man's control, in what is wrought by fire in such terrible manifestations of nature. Although the karma of Ahriman has been linked with that of humanity since the time of Atlantis, the suggestion should not arise that any guilt is to be attributed to those who are victims of what Ahriman's karma has evoked.

Such happenings are connected with the collective karma of humanity in which the individual has also to share. The causes which produce their effects in particular localities as the workings of Ahriman's karma often lie somewhere else entirely. It is however these particular places which afford the necessary opportunity. There we see a connection, which seems to be like a relic of catastrophes undergone by humanity in the far distant past. The power to work upon fire which man had formerly possessed, was withdrawn from him.

Hence, ancient Lemuria was brought to its destruction by the fire of the passions of men. The same fire that is now below was then above; it receded from the earth's surface and the same fire that issued as a kind of extract from the primordial fire is the inorganic, mineral fire of to-day. So too it was with the forces working through air and water which, again by way of the passions of men, led to the Atlanteancatastrophes. These catastrophes were evoked by the collective karma of humanity but a relic has remained and this relic awakens the echoes of those earlier catastrophes. Our volcanic eruptions and earthquakes are nothing else than the echoes of these catastrophes. "

Rosslyn Chapel, the Kabbalah and Rudolf Steiner:

A Lecture by Peter Snow on February 16, 2011

We were honored by an impromptu visit by Scottish, author, teacher and storyteller Peter Snow last month during which he offered a fascinating talk for our community entitled: "Rosslyn Chapel, the Kabbalah and Rudolf Steiner". About 25 persons attended, which was great considering the short notice about the lecture. It was held in the Eurythmy Room at the Emerson Waldorf School.

Peter began his lecture by telling us that he has been doing research on how the *Kabbalah* manifests in Rosslyn Chapel. In 2009 his book *Rosslyn Treasury: Stories and Legends form Rosslyn Chapel* was printed by Floris books. He hopes to write another book when his research is complete.

Peter lamented that Rudolf Steiner never visited Scotland, but says that he knows Steiner

would have loved it there, especially the sacred sites of Iona, Rosslyn Chapel and the Rosicrucian Gardens near Aberdeen. Nevertheless, some of Steiner's research can be applied to Rosslyn, for example his research on the Templars and the Kabbalah. The Templar influence at Rosslyn is undisputed, and has recently been made famous by Dan Brown's **DaVinci Code**. Snow made it clear he does not approve of the book, and told an amusing anecdote about how when the throngs of tourists began flooding Rosslyn after the DaVinci Code movie came out, a horse farmer who owns the land immediately adjacent to the Chapel hung up a sign on his fence that read "DaVinci Manure for sale!"

Peter gave a brief history of the chapel and its connection with the Sinclair family who are reputed to be Freemasons. Freemasons claim to be descendants of the Templars. The Chapel began in 1446 and was completed 40 years later, the same number of years it took for the Temple of Solomon to be built.

Many believe that the Holy Grail or the Templar Knight's treasure is hidden at Rosslyn. There is speculation about the "Apprentice Pillar" being the portal to the sacred relic or treasure that lies under it. Peter Snow believes that such thoughts are erroneous and that the Holy Grail is a "Path of inner development" not a golden chalice under the ground. Snow gave a very brief history of the Knights and said that following their defeat by Philip Le Beau in 1307 in France, some escaped to Scotland. They are credited with winning the Battle of Bannockburn in 1314 for Robert the Bruce where they defeated the evil Edward II, allowing Scotland to remain independent of English rule.

There are five sacred symbols of the Templars in Rosslyn Chapel: The Dove in Flight, the Pentagram, the Veil of Veronica, the Agnus Dei (Lamb of God) and the "Disembodied Hand". Snow talked about the relationship of the Templars to the Cathars, the Manicheans, and the Temple of Solomon (much of this is covered in great detail in his book).

Snow pointed out the interesting fact that the proper name for Rosslyn Chapel is "The Collegiate Church of St. Matthew". It is very interesting that the Church would have allegiance to St. Matthew, because it is in the Matthew Gospel that Jesus's lineage is traced to Solomon, and Solomon is of great interest to the Templars. In fact, legend has it that Rosslyn is a copy of the Temple of Solomon. (Peter mentioned that the authors Christopher Knight and Robert Lomas (*The Hiram Key*) believe that it is an exact replica, but Peter believes that although it has much in common, it is not an exact replica. At the entrance to Rosslyn is the head of Hiram Abiff, the builder of Solomon's Temple.


How do the Templars tie in with the Kabbalah? Well, one of the Templars, Comte de Champagne had a Kabbalistic school. Interestingly, Steiner's book on *The Gospel of St. Mathew* talks a lot about the Kabbalah. Steiner also spoke about the Kabbalah in a lecture to the Workmen given in 1924. One of the

main teachings of the Kabbalah is about the 10 Sephiroth and the "Sephirothic Tree" or Tree of Life as it is also known. Peter had on display several charts of the 10 Sephiroth and he demonstrated the correspondences between the Sephora, the 9 Hierarchies of Angels (with Man to become the 10th), the Planetary Spheres, The Ten Commandments, the décor in Rosslyn Chapel, the main organs of the Human body, the spiritual bodies Steiner has written of, and with the 9 Beatitudes. The Nine Beatitudes, by the way, are written of in the Matthew Gospel as well as in Steiner's book on it.

A bit of Kabbalah history was given: It developed in Spain in the 13th Century when a group of Jewish mystics wrote down their revelations. A Christian esoteric tradition of the Kabbalah also existed and its teachers include: Piero de la Mirandola, Ramon Lull and Robert Fludd. Fludd took the kabbalistic Tree of Life and created a mirror image of it, which is interesting since in Christian Churches one enters from the West and the high altar is in the East, while In Jewish synagogues, one enters from the East and heads west for worship. Fludd also made a correspondence of the Tree of Life to the human body.

Peter Snow mentioned that he had struggled for a long time trying to make the décor in Rosslyn to "fit" the kabbalah Tree of Life but that it didn't work until he read Steiner's Gospel of St. Matthew. Steiner also reversed the Sephora as Fludd did and then the correspondences made sense.

More interesting correspondences came to light when Peter talked about Jeshu ben Pandira, a member of the Essenes or Therapeuti, whom Steiner wrote about in his Gospel of St. Matthew. Jeshu lived 100 years before Jesus. He preached of the coming of the "One who will bring the 9 heavenly attributes into the realm of the active ego". What is meant by this?: That Christ passed through the 9 hierarchies and brought something from each to the earth. By coincidence (or was it?) Matthai was the name of the pupil of Jeshu ben Pandira who wrote of his Master (who was martyred) and Matthew was the Disciple of Jesus who wrote about him, who was the fulfillment of Jeshu's prophecy. What are these 9 attributes of the One? Peter Snow realized when doing his research that they are the 9 Beatitudes, which are written of in the Gospel of St. Matthew. Peter Snow went into



great detail about how these Beatitudes correspond to various décor around the Chapel such as: "Blessed are the merciful for they shall obtain mercy" corresponding to the Angel on the cover of Peter's book which is holding the heart of Robert the Bruce in its hands (more on this legend in Peter's book). He says this also corresponds to the Intellectual Soul.

The Essenes passed their teachings on to the Templars. The Cistercian monks are also connected to them.

Peter said in conclusion that Rosslyn Chapel points to the Past and the Future with the Grail in the Center. Peter had available his two books: *Rosslyn Treasury* and *The Shifty Lad: And the Tales He Told:* Celtic Fold Tales, which he autographed for those who made purchases. It was a great talk and we look forward to Peter's next book!

Peter Snow is a gifted storyteller and member of the Scottish Registry of Storytellers. He has been teaching English, Philosophy and Drama at the Edinburgh Rudolf Steiner School for 28 years. Prior to his teaching career, he had a wide variety of occupations including: social worker, psychiatric nurse and goatherd! He is married and has two grown children



Anthroposophy, which means "the wisdom of man", is a spiritual philosophy and path to self-knowledge, which "leads the spiritual in the human being to the spiritual in the universe", according to its teacher, Rudolf Steiner (1861-1925). Based on his indications, hundreds of initiatives have developed such as: the Curative education movement, the Camp Hill Villages for the handicapped, Weleda remedies, Dr. Hauschka cosmetics, WALA, True Botanica, Astrosophy, Rhythmical Massage, the Alliance for Childhood, The Christian Community, Anthroposophic Prison Outreach, Lazure painting, Demeter, advancements in architecture, science, social and economic reform (The Threefold Social Order, community banks), mathematics and painting.
