From the Editor:

Signs of Spring are stirring all over North Carolina, both overtly and within. All over the country feelings of new life and energy are dawning. This issue is chock-full of activities going on in our community, as well as in our country and even in the world (e.g.we have included an article about a Templar Conference in England, whose featured speakers include Judith von Halle and Peter Tradowsky among others!)

Especially inspiring is a report about a Youth Conference which our dear former ASNC member, Nathaniel Williams, led in Portland, Oregon. The zeal of these young people is awe-inspiring and gives us hope for the future. I was especially impressed with the beautiful poem of Karl Koenig's they shared in the article about the Knighthood of the 21st Century. This reminded me of Ed Stone's call to today's reincarnated Templars to be "Warriors of Compassion" and this fits right in with the Parzival Study that began on Sat. Feb. 28. (This newsletter is going to press before it transpired.) Compassion is the virtue that most needs to be developed in this Age of the Consciousness Soul. This was the lesson of Parzival. It is also the virtue that Judith von Halle states is the most important for developing the "Phantom" or Resurrection Body of the Christ. This ties in so perectly with the Virtue for March: "Magnaminity becomes Love". Compassion is intimately linked with the capacity for Empathy – a word that means intuiting what the other feels. If we can develop this faculty, then we would most certainly be led to compassion.

At last week's Elective Affinity Study group, Roger Schultz brought us an article by Baruch Urieli, entitled "Karmic Experience, Karmic Research and the Power of Empathy", an excellent article, from which we learned that the term "empathy" was only first coined in 1912! Urieli states that: "Empathy is not synonymous with sympathy. It is a newly developing faculty of man. What is entirely soul experience in sympathy, becomes permeated with a selfless will to help, to care, to love – and thereby starts to gain a spirit quality....The empathetic person begins to behold more and more consciously the inner reality of the person or of the interacting group pf persons and the setting he or she returns to." Urieli tells that in 1907 Steiner foretold of this new ability of empathy in one of his Esoteric lessons where he told of an "Organ of Gabriel " that would become active in humanity starting in the 20th century, which would eventually lead to a capacity for beholding the destiny of others "if they open themselves to the Etheric Christ, thus forming the space of selflessness in which the new cognitive faculty for destiny can unfold."

Urieli goes on to say that since the 1950's "hearts have begun to open in the world and so in Anthroposophical circles. It (empathy) is a growing faculty, and decade by decade more people will learn to use this..." One of the most important and beautiful passages in the article is: "Human love unites with the spirit force of the Christ stream of our time and thereby becomes able to order and transform the etheric web of old karma until it becomes a light-filled part of present life. This is a realm where human encounter can become a sacrament – and human encounter is to become a sacrament in a not too distant future, as Rudolf Steiner repeatedly pointed out. A true priesthood of our time is called to be pioneers on this path."

Let us seek this Path during this Lenten season!

The Colors of Cancer

A long journey has its beginning and end. When did *this* journey begin, and where will it end? A particular journey, such as an illness in a person's life, may have started many years ago, perhaps even lifetimes ago. In anthroposophical medical terms, by the time an imbalance or "disease" becomes manifest in the physical body, it has already penetrated the Spirit (Higher Self – "I" being), the astral and etheric (life force) sheaths, all the way down into the physical body.

"As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he." Jesus Christ

How we perceive and think influences our health and well-being. We are what we think! In the greater picture, we have no beginning and no end; we are immortal, as Spirit Beings of God and are all ONE. The material world is an illusion that we are thinking into existence. Is it that we created our own imbalances as experiences to teach us the next "lessons" we want to learn? Actually, it is only here on earth that we can develop ourselves on our journey to complete enlightenment.

One day I got a call from Rachel (not her real name) who had cancer and was being referred by an anthroposophical doctor for painting therapy. Beginning my work, I describe the Laws of Light, Darkness, and Color giving examples from nature. An adult patient then does "free" renderings (pictures not guided by me): two Light and Darkness pictures in charcoal and one watercolor painting. In the "free" color exercise, the patient has a choice of about 19 colors. Once the patient does three "free" pictures, at the fourth session I translate the color picture into Light and Darkness and looking at all the pictures I ask, where is the Light, the Darkness, do they meet, what colors are used and where, which ones are not used, etc.. Since Rachel was SO fragile at first, I could not ask her to do the charcoal pictures, so we went right into the color. First she did a "free" color picture and then I had her do another painting guided by me.

Liane Collot d'Herbois, Master Artist, and Ita Wegman, the first anthroposophical doctor, who worked directly with Rudolf Steiner, developed the method of painting therapy which I practice. It is a *medical therapy* based on the Universal Laws of Light, Darkness, and Colors as we see them in nature, and they exist within the three-fold human being of thinking, feeling, and will, as well as in other more detailed aspects of the human being.


The incarnation process of the Human Being's Spirit from out of the Spiritual World is, on the one hand, through the path of Light. In the upper pole through our thinking / nerve-sense system, Light brings us into incarnation. Light is linear, straight, and brings form, order and clarity in our thinking, and is *separating*. In the lower pole of our metabolic-digestive system, the Darkness provides a "vessel" for incarnation through warmth, substance and materiality, bringing the qualities of goodness, growth, nursing, loving care, and *wholeness*. Darkness carries the impulse for movement and for our connecting with the earth itself, which is essential for transformation, healing, and to come to manifestation. We must have warmth to digest our food - warmth and the will to do the deeds we are wanting to manifest here on the earth this lifetime.

And how are these two great forces of Light and Darkness meeting one another?

"Color is the dance between Light and Darkness." (Johann Wolfgang von Goeth

It is in the middle sphere of the cardio-vascular system – heart & lung - that colors weave together Light and Darkness, in the feeling life of the soul. In most all cancer patients that I've worked with, the colors of their "free" pictures are very light, sometimes hardly visible on the paper when dry. The patient is clearly excarnating - no longer in their body. I have also seen what Collot describes with cancer - a relationship to the color VIRIDIAN GREEN, the color associated

with the Light. The patients either cannot stand green - the very color that is healing for them - or

their green is a "dirty" green. And they are cold, for the light is cold. Cancer is a cold disease.

It then becomes my job to introduce them, very slowly, to the warmth of the earth again, giving them warm earth colors, helping them to incarnate, and move slowly to the viridian green and paint it very clean, not muddy or dirty. Using this green is healing for the thinking for it is related to the Light, our thinking, and the incarnation process. So, really, we are learning how to think more clearly. This can take more than a year, depending upon the case. With Rachel, in the beginning she could not stand the green. Therefore I started with the warmth of burnt sienna and brown madder, working toward the greens. After working with Rachel over a period of 8 months, she was getting stronger and stronger. Slowly she was able to use the viridian green and like

However when a patient really

wants to excarnate then my job is different. The patients themselves must decide, and I will know this through our working together, whether they want to "stay" here on the earth, or if they are ready to cross the threshold. In the former the colors used would be as described above. In the latter, one would take a totally different approach. Giving them violets helps to calm them in their journey in crossing the threshold, helping them to find the peace that passeth all understanding.

In one case, I painted with a very depressed elderly man with emphysema. In his "free" paintings he used a lot of indigo, the color associated with depression. In his last "free" painting, he took the violet, and I knew he was getting closer to the threshold. He died two months later, fully conscious, and in peace. Though the disease was different, the use of the color violet is the same for cancer patients. Violet can also be used for those having trouble with sleeping and agitation.

Painting therapy can also help, in the process of dying, for family members and friends, for those "being left behind". To paint with violet helps to bring a calming influence and *helps to connect with the one* who is crossing or has just crossed the threshold. Violet brings a spiritual connection into greater spiritual heights and depths, and leads one into the future with something new yet to come. Collot speaks of violet as "giving us a sense-organ for our karma; violet has a memory, carrying our past to us, putting it before our eyes, lay it in our hands... makes us more consciously aware of karma". (Light, Darkness and Colour in Painting Therapy by Liane Collot d'Herbois © 1988/2005 Emerald Foundation, third printing – Floris Books)

The awareness of karma, even on an intuitive level, leads us to our individual destiny. Working with Light, Darkness, and Color, it is my job to help each person to connect with their destiny path. The working of the Christ's Spirit between us brings the healing forces, through the warmth of love and compassion. I wish you a safe, joyous, and COLORFUL journey full of love!

FEBRUARY BRANCH MEETING FOCUSES ON MEMBERSHIP ISSUES

Kelly Calegar opened her beautiful Durham home to thirteen members of our Branch for the monthly meeting on February 21, 2009.

Most of the day's discussion was about a question brought up at the last meeting about what constitutes a "member" of our Branch and should we have various "tiers" of memberships as many organizations, including the Anthroposophical Society in America. Currently our branch by-laws state that a member of our branch must pay dues to the branch, as well as to the General Anthroposophical Society in America. Since a Membership Directory has been in the planning, the question arose: should we include in it people we might call "friends" of the branch – people who attend Study groups and events and whom we may have known for 20 years who do not pay dues, yet we feel closer to them than dues-paying members whom we never see (yet are of course, very grateful for their support!). One said that she would feel her umbilical cord had been ripped from her if she were dropped from the roles because she could not afford to pay dues.

The discussion was quite enlivened and many points of view were expressed. Some were adamant that to be considered a member one must give financial support. Others felt that due to severe financial hardship people should be allowed to give time instead. Others asked: if we allow people to be called members without any fees, what incentive is there for one to pay dues? To this one member responded that our branch should offer perks for paying dues, such as discounts for conferences and lectures. To those who favored the tier-system of membership, several responded that it is important that no one feel embarrassed about how much they contribute and that such a tiered list should remain absolutely confidential. Others absolutely thought a tiered system was wrong. One member suggested that the Board contact people whose membership has lapsed, just as the National Society did this past Fall. Some people simply forget that they have not paid; others may be bearing grudges that need healing. Another member said that dues should be paid or not paid in freedom; however, we should make more of an effort to explain how important dues are and encourage all to support "the Mother" as Rudolf Steiner often referred to the Anthroposophical Society.

Another member brought up an interesting point: currently only dues-paying members can vote – should we allow non-dues paying persons to vote on what we should do with the money in our Branch Home Fund?

One offered to set up a committee to discuss this issue further. Perhaps it will decide to propose a change in the by-laws. Another suggestion was for the Board to discuss it at a Retreat with a guest consultant such as Torin Finser.

Kelly Calegar reminded us that this year is the 100th anniversary of Steiner's revelation about the Parousia – the Appearance of Christ in the Etheric. She feels that this year will bring a renewed Presence of the Christ, as well as a rising of the Counterforces.

Peg Carmody announced that Andrew Linnell has offered to do a lecture for us the week after Easter. Members voted 7-6 for the "Madonna of the Rocks" by da Vinci over "The Singularity". The lecture will take place on Thursday, April 16. One member suggested that since the vote was so close, perhaps we could ask Andrew if he is wiling to do two. Peg will look into this possibility.

Peg announced that the Passaferos are selling CDs of the Christopher Budd conference for \$85 for 8 hours of audio. Most felt that they wouldn't have the time to listen to them even though most agreed that the theme is very pertinent for our time. Since there wasn't the enthusiasm anticipated, the idea has been tabled.

Mindy and Allen brought up the subject of Steve Berman coming here for a Conference. It was suggested that they form a Conference planning group and look into the costs.

Peg announced she will be writing a membership/dues letter soon.

Sally Fallon will be doing a workshop next week and we have been asked if we wish to set up a table with brochures. It will cost money. Most agreed it would be worth it

Mark reported that his practice is growing. He has around 50 members now for his new insurance plan. He is currently giving a course on Anthroposophical Medicine for the Foundation course. Mark suggested that members offer to do lectures for the teachers. We will take this up next time. - Kathleen Wright

NATHANIEL WILLIAMS LEADS YOUTH CONFERENCE IN OREGON:

A REPORT FROM LESLIE LOY:

Dear Friends,

As I sit here and think on this past weekend, I find goose bumps crawling up my arms and down my back because something magical happened, something perhaps even historic unfolded in the basement rooms of the Portland Waldorf School. In this report. I will strive to share what we did with the same level of consciousness and heart with which the 2009 North American Initiative Meeting was planned and unfolded. What I can clearly articulate now is that when twenty individuals, each engaged with Anthroposophy in his or her own way, come together and hold space with thought, feeling and intention, a new path is created for us all. On Friday, January 16 we opened the 2009 North American Initiative Meeting with a welcoming circle and met one another, through words and gestures, in the cold winter's night. The first meal we ate together was a hearty group cooked meal, shared by candlelight. These two events quickly brought the group together and with already a communal tone and energy, everyone gathered to hear Nathaniel Williams speak on the history, and intention, behind the Youth Section. What Nathaniel brought set the quality for our work together. Over the weekend, we were each able to really began to work with the five conditions which Rudolf Steiner indicated for the Youth Section in the context of the 21st Century in North America:

> Find other people who want to be together and spread the heart of Anthroposophy and who agree to meet regularly with missing as few gatherings as possible.

> The mood of these gatherings should be open and tolerant so that everyone feels free to speak agreements and disagreements fully.

Develop an enduring loyalty and remain so throughout life.

Do not listen for precision or thought technique but rather try to listen into a freeing experience of others.

Pour will into thinking so that it becomes felt even in the body as experiential thinking.

Dawn Stratton then led the group in exercises which included some honest foolery and which enabled us to meet one another in a simultaneously profound and

playful way. After already five hours of work, individuals parted ways, some going to bed to rest while others gathered 'round the fire in the chilly Portland air, basking in the glory of connecting with others who we were asking interesting and engaging questions. Flames were recognized and fires were sparked! Saturday morning, Julie Griggs led some exercises in Spacial Dynamics and Peter Alexananian brought singing exercises to the group. Together, these exercises awakened and heightened our senses to something greater at work—as we hummed our tones together, an electrifying current could be felt rising up in the air and spreading out, warming hearts and minds. But, perhaps, the most spectacular experience was the sense of something sacred being formed in between individuals, as listening was enlivened and hearts quickened, in developing a sensitivity towards understanding the depth and genuine joy of our collective work. Stefan Klocek, who graciously took on the task of facilitating our discussions, guided the group through dyad and group work around six central questions over the course of the Meeting:

- 1. What has inspired our work?
- 2. What challenges are we experiencing?
- 3. In what form is Anthroposophy appearing in our work?
- 4. How can we work together to bring our work to a new level?
- 5. What have we learned over this weekend?
- 6. How do we move forward effectively?

These questions were intentionally left ambiguous, to encourage real thinking and collaboration in discussion, in the hopes of stimulating and highlighting the similarities, and differences in how each individual thought and worked. Perhaps most exciting to witness was how the group discussions allowed for the collective whole to see the commonalities and the full picture of what inspired our work and how we were experiencing the work we were doing in the world. Understanding not only our individual work but also the impact and possibility of our collective work, empowered and inspired each of us to ask, "What can we do together? What task can we leave the Initiative Meeting with and return with to our communities?" And it was this question, focused specifically on the future of the North American Youth Section, which took the stage of our final discussion on Monday morning.

Together, the group worked consciously and deeply on every level to make this weekend not only a meaningful experience, but also one with far-reaching implications.

The twenty individuals who met were representative of an active and engaged body of young or youthful people who are interested in social change and in taking care of one another and the world.

Furthermore, concern for how Anthroposophy is portrayed and brought to the world and how this gesture can be enlivened and truly

nurtured in the world was discussed. Exercises in art, movement and thought allowed the entire experience to be a threefold exploration of how Anthroposophy lives within us and how we express it in our very selves.

On Sunday evening, a few Portland community members joined in the circle

discussion and shared thoughts and questions around what Anthroposophy was, whom it related to and, most importantly, how it engaged intergenerational conversations. Many of the participants were inspired by a question of bridging the gaps between generations, particularly the older and younger, and asked how this was possible. What was understood was that this could become a task of the youth to truly share their work with others and to listen and learn how others were actively seeking, researching, experiencing and sharing Anthroposophy in their own lives. While no singular answer was arrived at, what came together was a powerful group of people committed to a common task: a modern knighthood. Inspired by the flame in one another and by the call of the times to really change the world and to support one another more actively through engagement and interest in one another something was created and held, with the understanding that future work and meetings would be necessary to nourish what was born on this particular weekend. Together we walked away from our gathering with our own mantra, a verse that we can each work with, **Karl Koenig's poem on knighthood:**

There is a knighthood of the 21st century Whose riders do not ride through the darkness of physical forests, as of old, but through the forest of darkened minds.

They are armed with a spiritual armor, And an inner sun makes them radiant.

Out of them shines healing, Healing that flows from the knowledge of the human being as a spiritual being.

They must create inner order, inner justice, Peace, and conviction in the darkness of our time.

They must learn to work side by side with angels.

We invite you to join us and have chosen, by group consensus, to be reminded of this verse and our commitment to one another by the full moon and by any ambulance with its sirens sounding—a call to attention and to consciousness. This will enable us to elevate our awareness and to imbue the poem with our own conviction and sense of connection in that moment.

Many individuals came to the Initiative Meeting with the desire to feel less alone in the world and in their work and to find trust that the work that we were taking on was effecting real change. If anything, they left with the sense that they met nineteen other amazing individuals who understood



their experiences in the world intuitively and who consciously supported their work. It is rare, and indeed a blessing, to meet someone who truly understands to be committed to this work and it is even more rare to find someone who inspires the continuation and

collaboration of this work. But this is exactly what we found at the Initiative Meeting. Twenty inspiring voices, all seeking to connect through the commonalities, to trust in one another's work, to stand for good and to work together for an even better future for human beings in this world, came together and united, determined to return with their inspiration and their renewed enthusiasm to their local communities.

Now we can envision the web that stretches across North America, with pockets of activity throughout and strong shiny silver tendrils that connect each and every one of us to one another. This image is strong and strengthened by the sense of a new group of knights who are stepping into the foreground to carry on good work, to strive against the darkness, to inspire the light and to seek, within each individual they meet, that flame which flickers, alive, and filled with the possibility inspired by hope and vision. I can only express the gratitude that I feel for the heartfelt support for this unique experience that our entire community demonstrated. We are awakened to the future and to the infinite possibility it presents and we are motivated to actively engage with the task that stands before us. Join us and help us usher Anthroposophy into a new and enlivened era, focused on community, compassion and striving in these most intriguing of modern times. I also extend my appreciation for the incredible commitment of my fellow planners, for each individual who took on a leadership role and for those who followed each of us met our tasks with enthusiasm, with love and with a gesture of kindness that is simply moving to remember. NEWS From Tammy Hughes In China.....

It seems every taxi driver these days in Beijing wants to engage me in a conversation about the economic crisis in the U.S. once he knows I am American. Taxi drivers make very little money, as taxis are very cheap here. Over the years, money has often been a topic during the ride. Mostly drivers see you are a westerner and assume you are making a good salary. The drivers love to ask what you are making. In the beginning, I tried to answer, but I am sure they never really understood that I was here volunteering or on low wages. Obviously my Chinese wasn't enough to explain this, but also their assumptions about foreigners having money would have been difficult to overcome. Now I joke with them that we are all in Beijing to make money, as the drivers are not from Beijing. They come to the city to make money.

Many of the foreign Waldorf teacher trainers have come to China with an assumption that they would be helping the poor children receive Waldorf Education. In China, however, it is not the poor and the undernourished on a physical level that are seeking Waldorf Education. Those seeking Waldorf education are those that have been able to meet the basic needs and well beyond. In many ways, I think it is similar to the U.S. The rich keep getting richer and the poor poorer. Our kindergarten tuition is 3,000 rmb a month, which is the annual salary of a farmer whose son was just diagnosed with leukemia.

As a foreigner in China I have often struggled with the thought: why travel half way around the world to help affluent parents? Often the parents are struggling to get a perfect life for their one child. The parent's work can be very difficult. Now and again I have gone into the countryside to do some teaching or to look how can I do some teaching. The countryside is beautiful, but the living conditions are substandard. It is not straightforward how to help. In the beginning, I thought money can fix things, but actually a sudden influx of money or sudden new ideas doesn't seem to be the answer. My friend, Eckhart Loewe, feels it takes time, and one needs to stay in the countryside to live within the culture to really help the development.

I am making my work plan for the year, so I get another chance to see what is the real work I need to do in China.

Thank you for all your ASNC work. I love to hear how the development is going.




Comments on Last Month's Articles On Harry Potter and Barack Obama:

In reference to the interesting research information on the Harry Potter books which appeared in last month's *Sophia Sun*, I would like to add some remarks of my own.

I have read all the books (borrowed from my young adult grandchildren) and I admit I found them quite fascinating. Being interested in children's literature, I wanted to find out what all these millions of youngsters were attracted to. These are a far cry from the schoolgirl boarding school stories I was reading at their age — *The Twins at St, Clair's*, *The Girls of Mallory Towers...* a co-ed multicultural, multi-racial boarding school is a step forward: A Michaelic community! The thing that struck me most forcefully in book after book was the sense of the Threshold that occurs in various ways. Harry sets out to solve the mystery of his parents' death; he loses his godfather during the series, also a school friend, and finally his beloved headmaster. Rudolf Steiner intended to write seven mystery dramas. Due to his untimely death, we only have four. Are the seven Harry Potter books another way the spiritual world is attempting to work into ours? Those who have brushed aside or denigrated the books might want to give them a chance to work their magic.

In contemplating the destiny of our new President with all the cultural and racial threads woven into his background, I am reminded of Dr. Steiner's remarks on how an incarnation is planned centuries ahead. One feels this particular incarnation must be the work of high spiritual beings. - **EveOlive**



What is Anthroposophy?



Anthroposophy, which means "the wisdom of man", is a spiritual philosophy and path to self-knowledge, which "leads the spiritual in the human being to the spiritual in the universe", according to its teacher, Rudolf Steiner (1861-1925). Rudolf Steiner was a brilliant "Renaissance man" from Austria who was a philosopher, scientist, artist, playwright, architect, social activist, teacher and meditant, who had a direct perception of the spiritual worlds. Anthroposophy, which is also known as Spiritual Science, teaches, among other things, the laws of reincarnation and Karma. It has a Christ-centered view of world evolution. Steiner founded the School of Spiritual Science, as well as the General Anthroposophical Society, which he described as "a union of people who desire to

further the life of the soul – both in the individual and in human society – on the basis of true knowledge of the spiritual world". In addition to giving over 6,000 lectures most of which have been made into books, he helped to found many initiatives that are still thriving today including: the Waldorf School movement, anthroposophical medicine, biodynamic farming, and Eurythmy. Based on his indications, hundreds of initiatives have developed such as: the Curative education movement, the Camp Hill Villages for the handicapped, Weleda remedies, Dr. Hauschka cosmetics, WALA, True Botanica, Astrosophy, Rhythmical Massage, the Alliance for Childhood, The Christian Community, Anthroposophic Prison Outreach, Lazure painting, Demeter, advancements in architecture, science, social and economic reform (The Threefold Social Order, community banks), mathematics and painting.
